Exchange student's status at UOsaka	Special Auditor Special Auditor can take courses offered by School of Law/Graduate School of Law and Politics, or courses opened for all UOsaka students. Language requirements	It is desirable for exchange students to have sufficient English or Japanese language proficiency and submit one of the following certificates: (English) - TOEFL iBT 80 or higher (or 4.0 or higher for scores from January 2026 onward) - IELTS 6.0 or higher - TOEIC 750 or higher - Cambridge CAE or CPE with a grade of B2 or better - Official certificate/letter which proves English is the medium of instruction at home university (Japanese) - JLPT N2 or higher

Period of exchange	1 semester (2 terms) From April 1, 2027 to September 30, 2027, or from October 1, 2027 to March 31, 2028 2 semesters (4 terms) From April 1, 2027 to March 31, 2028, or from October 1, 2027 to September 30, 2028 *There is no class and students may leave after the examination periods.
Misc.	Applicants must be a student of their home university during all exchange period and return to their home university to graduate after the period. If they will graduate from their university during the period, we will not be able to accept them. Applicants shall, during the term of exchange, adhere to the rules of UOsaka, in addition to adhering to the rules of the home university.

Credit	45 hours of study including 15-30 class hours = 1 credit (approx. 1.8 ECTS) *Most single-semester courses are worth 2 credits. 1 class = 90 minutes 1 course = 15 weeks 15 weeks = 2 credits
Workload requirements (Minimum credits to be registered)	Exchange students are required to take a minimum workload of 10 hours (600 minutes) per week by the Immigration Control Law in order to be eligible for Student visa. Since one class basically takes 90 minutes, exchange students should register 7 courses or more per week to fulfill the requirement. 7 courses = approx. 14 credits per semester
Maximum credits to be registered	No limitation
Course registration	Exchange students submit a course registration form to Educational Affairs Section for designated period before each semester.
Grading scale	The GPA [Grade Point Average] system — The University of Osaka
Issue of academic transcript	At the end of each semester, an official transcript will be sent by e-mail to the students. Hard copies may be requested if needed.

How to nominate	Exchange coordinators should send the nomination form with following information by the deadline via e-mail. 1 Nominated student's name 2 Student's registered program at home university (e.g. Undergraduate/Master) 3 Student's major and affiliation at home university (e.g. Civil Law, School of Law) 4 Expected graduation/completion date at home university 5 Intended student status at UOsaka (Special Auditor or Special Research Student) 6 Intended period of exchange
Application deadlines	Spring Semester enrolment: November 10, 2026 Fall Semester enrolment: May 10, 2027
How to apply	Exchange coordinators should send the application documents in PDF format (except for 10. photo data) via e-mail.
Application documents	1. Application Form (*prescribed form) 2. Study/Research Plan (*prescribed form) 3. Nomination letter from home university 4. Official academic transcript from home university in English or Japanese 5. Certificate of language proficiency in Japanese and/or English (if applicable) 6. Results notification	Acceptance letter will be e-mailed to the exchange coordinator of students' home university after their admission is officially approved. Expected dates of notification are as follows: - For Spring Semester enrolment: late December - For Fall Semester enrolment: late June In addition to the above, instructions on visa and dormitory application will be sent to students.

ACCOMMODATIONS	
University dormitory	Exchange students may choose to live in university dormitories. Placement in the dormitories is not guaranteed—early application is advised to increase the chances of placement. VISA

Visa application	All international students who will stay in Japan more than 90 days are required to obtain Student (留学) visa prior to entry into Japan at the Japanese Embassy/Consulate in their home country. Certificate of Eligibility (CoE) is one of the necessary documents to apply for visa at the Embassy/Consulate. UOsaka will apply for CoE to the Osaka Immigration Bureau on behalf of exchange students. Detailed information on CoE application will be notified to students after their acceptance at UOsaka is officially decided. 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ESTIMATED LIVING EXPENSES	
Living expenses	The average monthly expenses (excluding tuition) of international students are approximately 101,000 JPY in Kansai region, where Osaka is located. Tuition	The tuition for UOsaka is exempted based on student exchange agreements between partner universities.
Mandatory insurance that exchange students are required to purchase	National Health Insurance: Covers 70% of medical bills. Insurance premium: 2,000 – 3,000 JPY per month (depending on the city where students live) University comprehensive insurance: Insurance premium: 3,000 – 15,000 JPY (depending on the type) How to apply for insurance is informed at the orientation.

SCHOLARSHIPS	
Scholarships	Unlike inter-university exchange agreement students, exchange students in this program are NOT eligible for the JASSO scholarships. If students wish to receive a scholarship, they are recommended to find and apply for one in their home country.
